

Ground Investigations for tidal flood walls

Lowestoft, Suffolk



What are we updating you about?

The Lowestoft Flood Risk Management Project will provide vital protection to the town against flooding from the sea. We are starting Ground investigation works (GI) for the tidal flood walls, which is the next step ahead of construction.

Where is this work happening?

The work will mainly take place on private land Royal Norfolk and Suffolk Yacht Club, ABP Land and Hamilton Road area, with some GI on the promenade in the South Pier area.

When are we doing the work?

Work began on 11th May and will last for approximately 6 weeks (but our timescales will need to remain flexible to allow us to conform to the current COVID-19 restrictions and operating practices). Works will be carried out generally between 8am and 5pm however there may be a requirement to work outside these times due to tidal dependencies.

What will we be doing?

We will be doing small scale coring work along with the potential drilling of small bore holes. Excavation of trial holes for materials and locating of services. We will make every effort to keep disruption to a minimum, but there may be some additional noise during these vital works. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause to the local community.

Why are we doing this work?

These works are important in determining the nature of the concrete strength, possible obstructions and any other potential considerations that need to be incorporated by the project team ahead of the construction of the tidal walls.


